Processing Holdings on June 1, 2020 are 14.4% or 17.9 million cwt. above the 3-yr. average. Although the COVID-19 Pandemic has had an effect on all sectors, the usage decline was most dramatic in processing, as sit-down portions of quick service and fast casual restaurants were closed. The decline in French fry production would actually be much larger as this time last year fry companies were importing potatoes from the United States to supplement their local factories. In recent days, French fry sales seem to have begun their climb back upwards as restaurants begin to open and fryers advise their contract growers they may need more raw product than what they had indicated a month earlier.
