**NOTES:**

The Eastern provinces continue to hold more stock than the west as has been the trend during 2022, above 3 year averages in all 4 reporting provinces. However, the late planting season and delayed growth may give more time to deplete these additional stocks. The additional 3 million hundred is doable given good demand and both fryers and fresh packers are currently making arrangements to deliver later into the season. Figures are very close to spring of 2020.
